


Figure 1. DC current Gain




Figure 2. Base-Emitter Saturation Voltage Collector-Emitter Saturation Voltage




Figure 3. Base-Emitter On Voltage




Figure 4. Output Capacitance


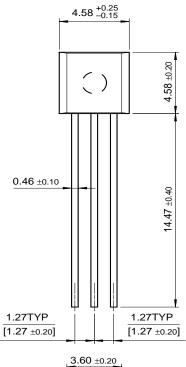



Figure 5. Current Gain Bandwidth Product


